
CBT has three sites this fall.

We recruit enthusiastic and able high-school and college-level volunteers to work with younger learners on a one-to-one basis. In addition to individualized academic work, ample time is devoted to value formation, character development and interaction with the community at large. Prospective tutors complete a thorough application, have a robust interview and take an orientation course before their first tutoring session.



Our leadership is an active, growing, hands-on, volunteer cohort of young professionals working in Finance, Medicine, Advertising, Law, Journalism and Education. They recruit volunteer tutors from local college and high-school communities through on-site visits coordinated with the efforts of resident teachers and administrators.

CBT young professionals proctor all tutoring sessions and provide additional educational activities. They also lead group discussions that focus on values formation and community issues. Regular community service outings are planned with the learners, tutors, college volunteers and young professional leadership all taking part.

The tutoring programs take place at community centers in the Chicagoland area. Here the volunteer high-school and college tutors meet one-on-one with young learners from local primary schools. CBT provides the structure within which positive interaction occurs among different age groups. CBT young professionals are at every session to facilitate and encourage these community-strengthening exercises.
